## What is a Firewall, and why is one important?

## What is a firewall?

Imagine a busy city intersection, where the traffic lights are out of service. There is a traffic officer regulating the flow through the junction.

A firewall is the equivalent of the traffic officer – it regulates the flow of traffic into and out of your network – whether the network is a large company, or an individual sitting on a home broadband Internet connection.

A firewall can cost from multiple tens of thousands of pounds (or dollars, or Euro, etc..) down to being freely available for download. For more information have a look at <a href="https://www.desertrat-it.com/broadband.pdf">www.desertrat-it.com/broadband.pdf</a>

## Why is it important?

The kind of computer virus known as a worm spreads from computer to computer, without any interaction – your PC could be harbouring a nasty without your knowledge!

A firewall is part of your defences against this kind of computer virus, as it prevents worms spreading onto your computer. A firewall can do a lot more than this, but the extra features are out of the scope of this document.

## So why the worry about worms and viruses?

In brief, for the last couple of years or so – since 2003 or thereabouts – worms and viruses have moved away from being vandals trying to delete your computer data, to making your computer act as a participant in criminal activities such as spamming, hacking, and industrial blackmail.

They do this by installing what is called a "back door" on your computer, which allows the criminals to take control of your computer without your knowledge or consent.

The use of a good anti virus program, which is **regularly** updated, cannot be emphasised enough. Please note the word in **bold** – **regularly**. Start up your anti virus program and check how long ago the virus detection patterns were updated – you should be updating **daily**, not weekly or monthly.

Also make sure you are actually protected by the anti virus programs – some of the big name anti virus programs stop working unless you pay them an annual subscription!
